



CURRAHEEN ROAD PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE

SAFETY IMPROVEMENT SCHEME

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Cork City Council hereby gives notice of its intention to carry out the following traffic management measures on Curraheen Road for the safety and convenience of road users.

The main elements of the proposed Curraheen Road Pedestrian and Cycle Safety Improvement Scheme are:-

- Upgrade of the existing pedestrian crossing located at Scoil an Spioraid Naoimh and installation of new Toucan crossing at Curraheen Walkway.
- Installation of upgraded pedestrian crossing facilities, including raised tables and tactile crossing points at sideroad junctions along Curraheen Road between Bridgefield Grove and Melbourn Road.

- Improvements works to the Rossa Avenue junction incorporating pedestrian and cycle safety measures.

- Installation of segregated cycle lanes.

- Adjustments to the existing road layout, including lining, parking etc

Accordingly, they will be included in the minutes of that meeting and may appear in the public domain. Cork City Council will retain data for no longer than is necessary and in accordance with the Council's Retention Policy and relevant Data Protection legislation.
