



ARCHITECTURAL CONSERVATION AREA GRANT SCHEME 2021 GRANTS FOR CORK CITY

Applications are invited for the Architectural Conservation Area (ACA) Grant Scheme for 2021. The closing date for receipt of completed applications is 4pm on Friday, 4th June 2021.

The City Council has allocated €100,000 to the scheme to assist owners of eligible structures in historic areas of the city to undertake necessary works to secure their conservation.

The scheme is not intended to assist in carrying out routine maintenance, alterations or improvements & the scheme does not apply to works begun before the commencement of the scheme. Maximum grants of €10,000 are available for successful applicants up to a maximum of 50 per cent of the cost of works. Cork City Council aims to achieve maximum value and impact for scarce public funds through this grant scheme and applications are prioritized.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY INTERVENTIONS – POPHAM’S ROAD NOTICE UNDER SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Cork City Council hereby gives notice of its intention to carry out the following traffic management measures in the interest of the safety and convenience of road users.

It is proposed to upgrade the pedestrian facilities and provide alternative parking facilities in the vicinity of No. 6 to No. 24 Popham’s Road.

The main elements of the proposed works in this location are:

- Removal of a section of existing steps to create a new graded footpath and existing steps to be retained adjacent to buildings.
- Provision of raised table uncontrolled pedestrian crossing.
- Provision of new set down parking facilities.
- New road marking and signage.
- Other necessary associated works.

Accordingly, they will be included in the minutes of that meeting and may appear in the public domain. Cork City Council will retain data for no longer than is necessary and in accordance with the Council’s Retention Policy and relevant Data Protection legislation.
